ADVOCACY WINS!

PCA PROGRAM PROTECTED!

2024 brought some major challenges as MassHealth proposed changes to the PCA program that would have cut hundreds of people in Berkshire County from the program. Our community rallied and made it known that PCA services are vital--and we won! When Governor Healey signed the state budget, language was included that protected eligibility for the PCA program. Our network of advocates also managed to delay a proposed centralization of intakes and assessments for services including PCA. Conversations continue about how to improve coordination on intake for services, but our advocacy efforts ensured that we are part of the conversation. Thank you to everyone who made their voices heard!

BRTA FREE RIDES AND EVENING CHAIR CAR SERVICE The Berkshire Regional Transit Authority recently expanded chair car services to include additional evening and weekend hours. This has long been a request of the disability community and a grant has allowed BRTA to deliver! Please be sure to utilize this service to ensure that it remains available for years to come.

Another big win within transportation—ridership will be free for all BRTA services including, chair car, from November 29th 2024-September 30th 2025! A huge thank you to the Healey administration for funding to make this possible and the BRTA for continuing to find ways to support our community.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS WORKSHOPS

AdLib staff member Valerie Pease hosted four workshops on Emergency Preparedness that walked participants through preparing for emergencies that may displace you from your home or force you to shelter in place for an extended period. Valerie's expertise comes from training in emergency response and volunteering for the Red Cross. During the workshops she shared ways to ensure people with disabilities receive accommodations and essential needs are met. Each workshop participant also received a kit that included four days of nutrition blocks and packaged water, hygiene and first aid kit, flashlight, emergency blankets, and masks. There are still kits available to households with a person with a disability. Valerie is available to assist individuals with developing their personal plan. I NEED HELP WITH HOUSING, WHERE DO I START?

So you're looking to move....

The rental process and finding assistance to move can be stressful. Here are some helpful hints to make it easier.

1.Subsidy (rent based on income) and voucher support have long waiting lists, so apply for them first even before you think you need them. You can apply via CHAMP online, at Pittsfield Housing on Columbus Avenue, and at Hearthway on Fenn Street in Pittsfield.

2.Get ALL the documents you need! To get a subsidy or rental unit you will need:

- a. Official Photo ID (state issued)
- b. Social Security Card
- c. Income statements (including SNAP or other benefits)
- d. Birth Certificate
- e. Proof of Employment or other income
- f. School enrollment if you are looking for a local preference
- 3.Begin your search for private/self-pay landlords. Most apartment listings and applications are online. If this is a barrier, find a local agency to help.
- 4.Get your CORI (through Community Legal Aide) and a credit report (experian.com or by mail). Check them and be sure that they are accurate before giving to a potential landlord. Many private landlords will let you submit your own rather than paying an application fee.
- 5. Visit Upside413 on Fenn Street in Pittsfield and apply for a letter of intent (LOI) from RAFT. If you need help with moving costs, you will need their approval letter to submit to potential landlords.
- 6.Keep all of your contact information current. Failure to reply to mailings or emails will mean losing out on apartments or being kicked off subsidy lists.
- 7.Fill out a general rental application and have it with you for viewings. That way you'll have all of your information ready to fill out paperwork. Most landlords choose from applications collected at viewings.
- 8.Maintain a log of applications submitted for your records and to follow-up. If your contact information changes you will need to know which agencies to reach out to and update.

It can be a lot of work, but completing these steps ahead of time can greatly increase your chances of being accepted by landlords. If you aren't able to complete these steps on your own here are some agencies who may be able to help (eligibility criteria will apply): AdLib, Elizabeth Freeman Center, 18 Degrees, Soldier On, ServiceNet, Upside413, Berkshire Community Action Council, MassAbility (formerly MRC), MassHire, Construct, and Wildflower Alliance.

Apply to Become a Board Member: As a non-profit, AdLib is overseen by a Board of Directors. Board meetings take place monthly for nine months of the year. Board Members must be willing to make a commitment to participate in Board activities and to be informed of AdLib's activities and mission.
